## MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR...

Once in a while, I post something about what is going to happen at church on our church's Facebook page. The question comes up from Facebook's algorithm-land, "do you want to make this an event?". I find that a little funny because it already is an event and I don't need Facebook telling me it could be or not be one. But I get it. If I post an "event", then it appears as an invitation on others' Facebook feeds and they can respond with whether or not they will attend.

As far as church life goes, everything we do is an event with an invitation automatically attached. There is no service or program or general happening that doesn't have within that service or program or general happening the all-important message: "please come...without **YOU** it won't be the same...your presence matters more than you will ever imagine...please come...we are looking for you because your presence brings us joy...we are far more when we are physically together than we ever are when we are not...please come."

Have you noticed that Jesus was all about the invitation? Invitation was at the heart of his ministry. "Come, follow me," is as clear as it gets! As with any invitation, a response is hoped for. Whoever heard Jesus' invitation in the moment had the option of saying, "oh, it's so nice you are thinking about me," and let that be it. So many things are easy to let in one ear and out the other after all. But we are talking about Jesus here and it's not hard to imagine he felt tremendous sadness when his invitation didn't carry weight.

All this is to say we hope and pray that the invitation inherent in all that we offer, and do, at church, carries weight. We hope it carries weight because the invitation of Jesus carries weight. It's his **Great Invitation** that is behind any and all of the ones we are all about. And, it's his **Great Invitation** that is behind all that we seek to do anyway. Once again, event and invitation matchup, but even in a more profound way than meets the eye.

This Advent and Christmas season, we are companions to one another along the way to the manger's side. As we light the candles of our Advent Wreath one by one, as we prepare our hearts in worship, as we encourage all ages with love and support through the hustle and bustle of activity, as we care for those in need beyond our walls, as we delight in singing our beloved carols once again; may we truly know all of this as the **Great Invitation of Jesus** and nothing less. My sincere hope is that you will hear the voice of the one who truly does the inviting deep in your heart. There are certainly a lot of other voices this time of year that speak loud and strong, and want our attention. Just because they want our attention doesn't mean we have to give it. We do have a choice, you know. We have a choice about who to listen to and how to listen. Who do you hear?

Michael and I so look forward to being with **YOU** as together we celebrate this most rich and meaningful time of year!

#### **BOARD BRIEFS...**

1. **MINISTER'S REPORT** – October 21 was a wonderful day of celebration with Michael's Ordination. It was certainly historic for our congregation, and Barbara was very grateful to everyone who made the day so special. She highlighted the bells, the choir, and Karen and Tony Cito for ALL the hard work on the beautiful reception after. It was great to feel connected to the ICCC in the experience with the presence of Phil Tom, Executive Director.
2. The Fairytale Forest on October 28<sup>th</sup> was a great success, and hope that it is a start of a wonderful tradition.
3. The "What's Brewing?" session by the United Family and Children's Society of Plainfield presented the different ways they offer mental health support. It is such a wonderful thing to be a partner with them through our annual Christmas gift drive. Bags to be filled will be available Nov. 25 and Dec. 2.

4. The yearly tradition of the Covenant Blood Drive followed by the 40<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Thanksgiving Covenant Service with St. Mary's shows the special relationship we have had with each other.
5. **YOUTH AND FAMILY SERVICE REPORT** – Michael spoke of his deep thanks to the Board, along with Tony and Karen for the wonderful celebration of his ordination.
6. The Fairy Tale Forest was well attended, not just by members of the congregation but by many from the Watchung community.
7. Michael presented the idea of asking an active youth member to be part of the Church Board. A motion was made by Betty Ann to accept a youth position of the board for the period of 3 years, to be fulfilled by 3 members, one year at a time. Laurie Conley seconded, motion was passed.
8. **FACILITIES** – Tony reported that the lighting over the buffet tables in front of the kitchen in Fisher Hall has been replaced, just in time for the Ordination celebration.
9. The film on the windows in Fisher Hall has been completed.
10. The circulation pump in Blackburn Hall failed, and the wing was without heat while waiting for replacement parts. A long range plan is being developed to replace each of the three boilers in that wing, one at a time.
11. The replacement windows for the three sets of windows in Blackburn wing have been ordered.
12. There is a new leak in the library roof, where the old and new roofs meet.
13. The potholes in the circle of the driveway were discussed.
14. The Fisher Hall kitchen has had a deep clean, from ceiling to floors.

#### **NOTE FROM YOUR TREASURER...**

##### **Financial Facts**

Usually, I am only able to report the numbers from two months prior. Timing has worked out regarding Sunday giving, so I am able to comment on preliminary November status. Obviously, we have 5 more days of expenses in November, but I've tried to account for regular expenses.

##### **From preliminary November report:**

- We have continued our giving increase trend, up by about \$2,000 over November 2017.
- November should come in about \$4,000 on the plus side for our giving vs expenses ratio. Again, this is an estimate.
- We also received another \$13.75 in October from **Amazon Smile** purchases. Every little bit helps! - Unfortunately, we still have an over **\$22,000 deficit YTD**. That is better than the almost \$33,000 deficit in 2017, but still concerning. I am hopeful that historical year end giving, as well as our slight upward trend bring us to at least a balanced budget. Your extra gift in the enclosed Christmas envelope will be a big help.

As we enter the advent season, let us prayerfully consider how you can contribute, either monetarily or in service to this, *YOUR* church and all the great work we do. Pam Davis
