A MESSAGE FROM MATTHEW MAY

FINANCIAL FACTS

At this writing, we have gone through the winter and Easter seasons which provide a good picture of our financial status at this point in the year.

Our year-to-date income vs revenue status is showing a relatively small deficit, mainly due to a gentle winter and the generous Mitchell Trust.

Our congregational giving is about \$10,000 behind the budgeted amount through April.

We average about \$25,000-\$30,000 a month in revenue and expenses.

Congregational Giving usually makes up about 30%-35% of that revenue amount, with our interest/ROI and Mitchell Trust making up most of the difference.

Our Executive Board continually explores fundraising opportunities, and we need the support of EVERYONE to step up and contribute in whatever way you can, not only financially, but by contributing your talents, gifts and participation to help make our ministries the best they can be. The Frippery has also recently donated \$1,600 toward Patricia and her sons that are currently staying at the Howard Johnson's hotel hoping to find a safe secure apartment soon.

We have committed \$500 to our vacation Bible school for extra fun activities this summer. Lastly we will make our annual \$2,500 donation to the Starfish Food pantry to help fill their shelves over the summer months.

We will be accepting donations for our September opening on Thursdays in the summer after July 13.

Our Christian faith continually reminds us of our responsibility to co-create environments and relationships that honors Jesus' message of care and healing. As Christians we are all invited to cultivate a thriving humanity that honors the interconnected goodness of God. This shared commitment relies on our ability to ensure Wilson Memorial Church is a place where folks experience a barrier-free environment, while feeling affirmed for who they are and how their lived experience exemplifies the body of God. The Equity & Justice committee at Wilson cherishes our responsibility to create operational, building and programming structures that prioritize the needs of our community, especially our siblings who have been historically excluded or dismissed. Over the past several months the following actions have been taken to expand access, comfort, belonging and compassion at Wilson.

- Equitable Sharing of Labor: In April, May & June of 2023 Pastor Michael Dreoge requested and received bereavement time away from his pastoral role and responsibilities. Matthew May, with support from visiting speakers, continues to serve the Wilson community.
- Open & Flexible Seating: In February and March of 2023 open & flexible seating was created in the sanctuary to provide access for wheelchair, walker and stroller users. Open space was created in the choir loft and the piano was moved to the choir to provide additional aisle access. The sanctuary podium was repositioned to remove sight barriers and allow for an expanded multisensory experience.
- Gluten Free Communion: In January Wilson launched our commitment to provide gluten free communion and coffee hour options.
- Critical Learning: In April on the first Sunday after Easter the Faith Formation newsletter articulates Autism Acceptance vs. Autism Awareness.
