## MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR...

There's nothing in life that compares with being named in a way that makes us feel special and cherished. Often such naming comes about from the connection between parent and child. I remember when our daughter Alison was about two and we were waiting in a doctor's office. There was a very grandmotherly looking woman waiting there as well, and to pass the time she asked Ali, "What is your name?" In very shy, muffled way, she rapidly said "Alison Grace Peters". Not hearing well, the woman politely responded, "I'm sorry, I didn't get that. What is your name?" Again Ali said very rapidly, "Alison Grace Peters". The woman still didn't get it. Finally she decided to take a new angle. She asked, "What does your mom call you?" This time, loud and clear, Ali said, "SWEETHEART!"

Hearing a parent use a term of endearment can soften the most hardened heart. I thought about this when I read Fr. Greg Boyle's first book, *Tatoos on the Heart*. (Some of us are reading his second book, *Barking to the Choir* in preparation for our May 23<sup>rd</sup> potluck and book discussion and please see the details about this evening in the announcement on p.4 of this Hilltopics!) Fr. Greg works with former gang members in California as they struggle to leave their old life behind. In an interview on NPR, he recounts a story about one of his young friends which he also writes about in *Tatoos on the Heart*.

I met this kid, and he was kind of gang-posturing mode. And I said, 'What's your name?' And he said, 'Sniper'. I said: 'Trust me when I tell you your mom didn't take one look at you and name you Sniper when you popped out. What's your name?' And he said, 'Gonzales'. I said, 'well, I know the staff here calls you Gonzales, but I still, I'm looking for your birth certificate here. What's your mom call you?' And then he says, 'Cabron' which is kind of a salty word in Spanish. And I said, 'I don't doubt that she calls you that on occasion. I'm looking for birth certificate here.' And then he kind of quiets down and gets very gentle and transformed a little, and he says 'Napoleon'. And I said, 'wow, that's kind of a noble, different name, but I still don't believe that she calls you the whole nine yards, Napoleon. What does your mom call you?' And then I watched this kid sort of go to this distant, untraveled place, and he gets very quiet and very age appropriate, and he says: 'Sometimes when my mom's not mad at me, she calls me Napito.'

I think about how Mother's Day has become such an important celebration in the month of May and some of us can recall feeling the kind of warmth and love I'm talking about from mothers, or parents, or significant parental figures in our lives. Others of us still long for what we feel like we never received growing up. The honest truth is that Mother's Day can be a mixed bag. Yet, my main point is this: all of us can hold on to the safety and security of knowing we don't have to rely solely on human relationships in order to hear what we long to hear. This is no small reality to absorb. God names us too, you know. God calls us *beloved*. I hope you can hear that as the term of

endearment it truly is and do so picturing the way a parent would say to a precious child, "YOU are so beloved!" Are you truly able to hear this as your naming and let the truth of it seep in and soften any hardened corners of your heart? I hope so. If you don't, the fact of the matter is, I hear it for you. Others do as well. Isn't it your time to hear it too?

#### ***BOARD BRIEFS...***

1. **MINISTER'S REPORT** – Barbara reported that while we only got in two of our Soup Suppers and services due to weather issues, she cherishes the time some of us did have to share a simple meal and worship together.
2. Barbara attended an Enneagram Personality Type theory workshop the first weekend in April, which, as she learned Proctor and Gamble is using for employee training. The Enneagram is a wonderful tool for self-discovery, and for understanding the difference between us and others. The second workshop she is attending at the end of April focuses on the applications of the Enneagram for Spiritual Directors as well as those working as Executive Coaches or Mental Health Therapists.
3. There will be two upcoming Chapel Wednesdays before they resume again in the fall, May 2nd and June 6th. Come to the Chapel at 7:15pm for a contemplative experience of spoken reflection, guided meditation and silence. The gatherings last 45 minutes. Invite others to join you!!
4. Barbara has begun the 8-week series on Grief Recovery, which meets Tuesday evenings.
5. On Sunday, May 6, the Jazz trio will once again be joining us during our Worship Service. The service will be in Fisher Hall that day due to the set up in the Sanctuary for the joint bell concert that afternoon. We are grateful to Pam for setting up this concert between our church, Union Village Methodist and First Presbyterian Church of Stirling. The time is 4:30pm with a potluck to follow. Please mark your calendars and come and show your support.

6. A note of thanks goes to Carolyn Musacchio for offering the yoga class to us for the last 4+ years. Due to declining attendees, she has decided to hang up the yoga mat for this class. Thanks to Carolyn for introducing yoga to so many in our church.
7. **YOUTH AND FAMILY DIRECTOR'S REPORT** – Second Sunday went well. The beach party was attended by 5 kids and their parents, playing in the sand, listening to music and dancing the limbo!
8. VBS was cancelled for summer 2018 due to extended school year and inability to adjust the planned dates. VBS is now being planned this year as "VBS In A Day" on a Sunday, July 1<sup>st</sup>.
9. Mission trip update – enrollment closed; current enrollment: Eight.
10. **FACILITIES** – Paul Ost and Tony Cito are experimenting in the Chapel with LED lights versus current incandescent lights; Tony met with electrician to get scaffolding or other safe equipment for dealing with lighting.
11. The trees in front of the Frippery are still scheduled to be taken down and mulch to go on the trail behind the church parking lot, as soon as the tree company is done with dealing with the Nor'easter damage.
12. Sample UV films were installed on two of the sliding doors of Fisher Hall, so that folks can view the options in a bigger area. The congregation was asked to vote on which film they like, so that it can be scheduled for installation.
13. Roofing companies have been contacted to come back and remediate some of the leaks in both Fisher Hall kitchen and the Sunday School wing.
14. Clean-up of the area behind Blackburn Hall to be scheduled, so that Christmas decorations can be put away, along with spare building supplies. Shelving is to be put up to assist in keeping stuff off the floor and keeping it orderly.
15. **MEMBERSHIP COMMITTEE** – A new "Welcome to Our Church" pamphlet has been completed, and is scheduled to be placed in the pews shortly.
16. **MEMORIAL ENDOWMENT** – Scout Enzo Ruta's Eagle project has been approved for the History Room, and will begin shortly. The small task group will be meeting with Alex Ruta to go over the plan for a fence and play area behind Fisher Hall. Matthew Stefanovic's project has been held up by the town requesting further documentation of the site.
17. **PRESIDENT'S REPORT** – The emergency response team will be researching companies to submit a bid for installing an emergency generator.
18. **NEW BUSINESS** – A church cleanup is to be scheduled in May.
19. **PERSONNEL** – The new position for Church School Admin position has been posted.
20. **OLD BUSINESS** – Fundraising –The new committee will schedule a meeting before the next board meeting.
