#### **BOARD BRIEFS...**

1. Barbara thanked Michael and the board for holding down the fort while she was out.
2. The SCREENAGERS showing in Fisher Hall was a great success, with close to a hundred attending. Michael led the group in games prior to the showing, and there was great intergenerational discussion afterward.
3. Our Soup Suppers and Service begin this Wednesday and of course 6:30 pm is the supper and the service will begin at 7:30pm in the Chapel. Barbara hoped that the weather would be good for the first supper since we will have a big snow storm this week. The rest of the schedule is 3/22-Woman's Guild, 3/29-The Executive Board, 4/5 Barbara Diem and friends. The theme for this year is The Power of Forgiveness.
4. For the Sunday Services during Lent, Reverend Barbara will be doing a sermon series on the Stations of the Cross. Yesterday was Jesus and Pilate, Sunday 3/19 will focus on the mocking of Jesus, 3/26 will highlight Simon of Cyrene carrying Jesus' cross, and on 4/2 we will reflect on the weeping of the women of Jerusalem.
5. Doyle and his cooking crew are planning on doing a breakfast before church on Palm Sunday, April 9th. This tradition will not only mark Palm Sunday but the fact that

we will celebrate our six Confirmation students during the service.

6. Michael Droege thanked everyone for their help and support during Barbara's absence. Michael had a finished Lenten poster, which he showed us. He has asked eight families to invite other people to help them complete the posters, which will be displayed during Holy Week. They will be on the wall of the ramp leading to Fisher Hall.
7. Last week we hosted a luncheon for a group from Plainfield as part of reaching out to our communities. They have requested permission to hold the Kindergarten graduation service at our facilities. Michael is looking forward to expanding the intergenerational experiences.
8. Facilities Chairman Anthony Cito said they are working on the basement doors. Also the roofer will be here on Monday 3/20 to look at the Manse garage roof. He is looking into the railings leading to the upper parking lot as there is no way to currently get a good grip on the railings especially for our senior worshipers.
9. Lorri Monetti is looking into a way to darken Fisher Hall to enable us to have program requiring the use of the screens. As of now there is no glare prevention material in place. The use of drapes was not recommended at this time due to cost and maintenance concerns. Lorri to follow-up for next meeting.
10. Covenant Committee – Bruce Ryno reminded us of the joint service on March 26<sup>th</sup> at 4 PM. Also there will be a Blood Drive on April 1<sup>st</sup> at the Exempt Firemen's Hall.
11. Membership Committee – Keith McNally reported that ad's will be placed in the Connection and in the Echo for the Easter service.
12. President Lorri requested help with the website. The committee looking into revamping the site will meet Saturday in the library. Meeting is open to all as they are looking for new concepts to keep the site up to date. Also they are looking into being able to offer paying your pledge online and what security factors are available. We may need some professional help with this.

#### **NEW BOOK GROUP BEGINS IN MAY ...**

If you have ever wondered, "Why am I the way I am?" or "Why is my family member/friend/coworker the way they are?", this new book group is just for you! Please join us as we delve into a fascinating way of understanding our personalities and the direction we can grow personally and spiritually. We will be reading and discussing ***The Road Back to You*** by Ian Morgan Cron and Suzanne Stabile. This book is based on a contemporary understanding of a very ancient tool call the Enneagram. As the summary of the book states, "the Enneagram's uncanny accuracy in describing how human beings are wired, both positively and negatively, has spiked its popularity in recent years... ***The Road Back to You*** is rooted in this approach to formation, which Thomas Merton described as the one challenge on which all of life rests: to discover our true selves in discovering God, and to find more of God in finding our true selves." Discussing this book will be an amazing adventure in both self discovery and understanding others with compassion.

#### SUNDAY SCHOOL NEWS...

The Sunday School classes start with the weekly music sessions with Jim Musacchio. The students then hear a story told by a volunteer from the congregation. They then go to their classrooms to participate in the activity planned for that day related to the story.

**April 2<sup>nd</sup>** This is the 3<sup>rd</sup> session on the story and lessons of "Palm Sunday to Easter Sunday". The teachers will have a computer lab class to continue the lessons in the story.

**April 9<sup>th</sup> Palm Sunday** The Sunday School classes will have a story of "Palm Sunday" and the children will participate in the church service by handing out the palms during the worship service on Palm Sunday.

**April 16<sup>th</sup> Easter Sunday** There will be no Sunday School classes on Easter Sunday so that the entire congregation may join together in worship.

**April 23<sup>rd</sup>** We begin the next Sunday School session with the story "The Lord is my Shepherd". The Sunday School children will hear the story and the teachers will have a Bible skills and games session about the lesson.

**April 30<sup>th</sup>** We continue with the story "The Lord is my Shepherd" and the Sunday School classes will have an art lesson related to the story.

Would you like to read the story to the children in Sunday School? There are only a few more Sundays left to sign up!! Check the table outside the Fellowship Hall for the stories dates and sign up sheet! Have you looked at the pictures that are also posted each week on the bulletin board outside the Fellowship Hall? They show what the kids have done that day in Sunday School.

1. Their Bible
2. Offering – (the Sunday School offering is used towards supplies and the Sunday School curriculum for all classes).
3. Food for Starfish! (We have a container under the hallway "payphone" to collect food each week).
