MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR...

In the book, *Secrets In the Dark*, Frederick Buechner shares a wonderful and classic story about a Christmas pageant at an Episcopal church. He writes,

The manger was down in front at the chancel steps where it always is. Mary was there is a blue mantle and Joseph in a cotton beard. The wise men were there with a handful of shepherds, and of course in the midst of them all the Christ child was there, lying in the straw. The nativity story was read aloud by my friend with carols sung at the appropriate places, and all went like clockwork until it came time for the arrival of the angels of the heavenly host as represented by the children of the congregation, who were robed in white and scattered throughout the pews with their parents.

At the right moment they were supposed to come forward and gather around the manger saying, ‘Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace, goodwill among men,’ and that is just what they did except there were so many of them that there was a fair amount of crowding and jockeying for position, with the result that one particular angel, a girl about nine years old who was smaller than most of them, ended up so far out on the fringes of things that not even by craning her neck and standing on tiptoe could she see what was going on. ‘Glory to God in the highest and on earth peace, good will among men,’ they all sang on cue, and then in the momentary pause that followed, the small girl electrified the entire church by crying out in a voice shrill with irritation and frustration and enormous sadness at having her view blocked, ‘**Let Jesus show!**’

Don’t you think that child’s words were right on the mark? “Let Jesus show” is our cry as well when so much at this time of year crowds out and blocks the view of the Christ child born once again. Commercialism blocks the view. Busyness and frantic gift buying block the view. Expectations of ourselves and others block the view. Sadness and personal grief block the view. And yet, the truth of the matter is that we don’t *have to* let all of that block our view. Let’s remember that Jesus has a way of showing up no matter what and our job one is to heed the words of John the Baptist who quoted from the prophet Isaiah: “Make straight the highway of the Lord.” With a straight, direct and unobstructed highway, the view is not blocked.

Won’t you let Jesus show? Letting Jesus show this time of year means allowing ourselves to be shaped by a different priority than the priorities we see around us. It means staying focused on why we do what we do anyway – be it in our homes, in our church or just in our daily walks. Again, won’t you let Jesus show? Blessings to you and yours at this beautiful time of year!

1) MINISTER'S REPORT HIGHLIGHTS

- Barbara expressed a "big congratulations" to our entire congregation for raising \$3,575 for disaster relief during our October month long drive!
- She encouraged participation in the monthly Chapel Wednesday sessions (7:15-8:00pm) that includes music, reflection, guided meditation, and silence for personal prayer. The next one is December 6.
- Plans are progressing for our **Shop For Good** Fair Trade Holiday Sale, Saturday, December 2, 10am-2pm. This is a great opportunity to give people awareness of the economic struggles in other parts of our world. Everyone on the Board is asked to take a flier home and see that it gets put up at a place of your choice especially in Watchung, Green Brook, Warren or Berkeley Heights.
- Because the Advent season is such a special time of year, Barbara and Michael hope everyone will pay special attention to using it to help them prepare for a meaningful Christmas. Please remember that Dec. 24th is on a Sunday, so we will have our morning Worship Service and then our Christmas Eve Services (5pm and 10pm).
- Barbara reported on her wonderful and enriching experience at her training for The Grief Recovery Method which she attended in October. This is a specific program developed to help people deal not only with the death of someone close to them, but other forms of loss in life (divorce, job etc.). As a Grief Recovery Specialist, she has been trained to meet with individuals one-on-one as well as in a group setting. More information about opportunities will be forthcoming.

2) YOUTH AND FAMILY MINISTRIES HIGHLIGHTS

- Michael reported that he is especially focusing on faith development at home and intergenerational opportunities. His goal is to get parents to join him in learning how to do faith development at home beginning with a simple book as a launching point for further development of faith at home. He also wants to form an intergenerational team to help look at the ministries at Wilson and make sure we are doing the job we need to do to develop relationships and root the next generation. The work being done is in places like the ushering team and bell choir as a start.
- Mission Trip: Michael submitted a proposal to do an "all church" or "intergenerational" mission trip this year. Hurricane Harvey has opened the opportunity to care for people in a unique way. The mission trip to the Houston area would be August 6-11 2018, and be open to St. Mary's families as well. The Board voted to support the continued investigation of this project.
- Trail Project: While cancelling our Halloween event was a disappointment, the event did encourage one of our students, Abby Wighard, to do her Girl Scout Silver Award project there. Abby will be taking one of our outdoor benches (outside already) and making a "Kindness Corner".

- 3) **FACILITIES** – Tony Cito reported that the choir room deep clean, including the chairs, had been completed. Blackadar Heating and Plumbing will be contacted to check the AC dehumidifier units to make sure that they are functioning properly. Other projects include waterproofing the exterior wall of the choir room, improving the railing to the upper parking lot, completing work on emergency lighting and work on the Blackburn Hall sump pump.
- 4) **STEWARDSHIP UPDATE** – The envelopes are distributed, and we are encouraging all to return by December 3rd.
- 5) **NEW BUSINESS**
- Nominating Committee – Two board members, Keith and Cota, have offered to serve a second term. There will be a need for Board members for one full term and one unexpired term plus a Clerk and Treasurer.
 - Memorial Endowment Committee – A project approved by the MEC for work at Timothy Christian School was reviewed and partially approved. A second vote for final approval is in progress.
 - Assistant Treasurer position proposed – Hugh Woodruff suggested that we re-instate the position of Assistant Treasurer, and to elect Pam Davis. Motion was proposed by Keith, seconded by Betty Ann, and approved.
 - ICCC – The Board was asked by Roberta Smith, ICCC Financial VP, for our agreement on allowing them to re-categorize a portion of the excess Ost Fund money as general operating funds to help with the 2017 shortfall and the Board agreed.
- 6) **OLD BUSINESS**
- Fisher Hall Fees – Continued discussion was made, with the issues regarding the definition of a non-profit. Keith to take the chart to review and revise.
 - The request by the Church of God and Saints for the use of Blackburn Hall by this group was discussed in length, and a final vote was made. The request was denied by the Board due to conflict of use by other groups as well as additional stress for support.

COVENANT COMMITTEE...

The Covenant Committee is thankful for the choirs, readers, speaker and those who helped with the refreshments and planning for our Covenant Thanksgiving Service. We also thank those who kept others in mind and gave at the Blood Drive on November 18th. Our total of collections was 43 units. We will be holding another Drive in the Spring and our annual Unity Service will also be scheduled for the late winter or early Spring. More information to follow. Enjoy this Christmas Season!
